Household Trash Program:

I.E.S.I. Solid Waste Services will provide trash removal service once per week.

Please review the following information:

- Trash service includes one (1) toter per household.
- If you require more service, please contact our office or go to St. Clair City Hall for pre-paid tags (\$0.60 each) to attach to any extra waste containers or bags.
- In addition, we will pick up one bulky item or white good per month. You must call our office to schedule this pickup.
- Please have your trash to the curb before **6:00 A.M.** on your scheduled service day.

Yard Waste Program:

I.E.S.I. Solid Waste Services will provide yard waste removal service once per week. The following instructions **must be** met to have the yard waste picked up:

- Up to eight (8) biodegradable, "KRAFT" paper bags or 33 gallon cans with leaves, grass, or twigs.
- Bundles of twigs and/or branches tied with twine (no plastic) up to four (4) inches in diameter placed at the curb.

Please have your yard waste to the curb before **6:00 A.M.** on your scheduled service day.

Recycling Program:

I.E.S.I. Solid Waste Services will provide recyclable removal service once per week.

Recyclable materials are accepted in the recycling bin provided:

The Commingled Container Stream

- Glass bottles and jars (clear, brown, green)
- Aluminum cans
- Aseptic packaging & gable top containers (milk & juice containers)
- Steel & tin cans

Recyclable Plastics

PET Soda, water, & flavored beverage bottles. (#1 clear & green plastic)

HDPE Detergent & fabric softener containers (#2 colored plastic resin)

PVC NARROW-NECK CONTAINERS ONLY (#3 plastic resin) such as margarine tubs, frozen dessert cups

LDPE Grocery containers (#4 plastic resin)

PP Grocery containers (#5 plastic resin) such as yogurt cups, narrow-neck syrup & ketchup bottles

NOTES

- All containers must be emptied, rinsed clean, and caps/lids removed.
- NO motor oil, insecticide, herbicide, or hazardous chemical containers
- NO plastic bags (grocery, Wal-Mart, etc.)
- NO plastic film (no plastic sheets, tarps, or wrap)
- NO window glass, dinnerware or ceramics
- NO cardboard, magazines or books of any kind.

The Paper Stream

Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeve)

Tie with twine or place in a paper bag.
